John Hisle is a Partner with Martin, Blanck & Associates, a federal health services consulting firm based in Falls Church, Virginia. John Hisle joined Martin & Associates in August 2005 after a distinguished career in the federal government, culminating in his retirement from the Senior Executive Service (SES) as Director, Federal Occupational Health Service (FOH).

From 1993 to 2005, Mr. Hisle served as the Director of this \$200 million federal health care program, which provided a range of occupational health consultations and services to all federal agencies. Services included clinical, behavioral and environmental health care testing, assessment and service delivery. FOH was a unique entity within the federal government, one of only six franchise programs that received no congressional appropriations. Functioning as an entrepreneurial agency within government, FOH “sells” its services to other agencies on a reimbursable basis – competing and sustaining its business through price competitiveness, value, and customer service. Under Hisle’s leadership, the program was recognized by OMB and the Congress for Entrepreneurial Excellence.

Prior to his responsibilities at FOH, Hisle served from 1990 to 1993 as the Deputy Director of the Community and Migrant Health Centers Programs, a \$1 billion grant program within the Dept. of Health and Human Services supporting access to primary medical care for more than 13 million medically underserved persons throughout the U.S.

For the three years preceding this position, Hisle was Deputy Director and Director of the National Health Service Corps, a \$100 million program within the Department of Health and Human Services providing medical practitioners to medically underserved communities through scholarships and loan repayment. Hisle has held a number of other managerial positions with the Department of Health and Human Services with a particular focus on improving access to health services for medically underserved populations and communities throughout the United States.

John holds graduate degrees in health care administration and sociology, and an undergraduate degree in economics from Fairfield University.
