As a Board Certified Preventive Medicine Physician, Dr. Bradley has extensive experience as a director of public health for several large military communities to include Fort Carson, Colorado and Landstuhl, Germany. Additionally, he served as the U.S. military Public Health Consultant for the European Regional Medical Command and for the 18th Medical Command – Republic of Korea. He has dealt with a variety of public health concerns and developed effective programs and policies to protect and promote the health of communities.

Dr. Bradley also has first hand experience and expertise in emergency preparedness and chemical/biologic surety. He was responsible for the operational oversight of the healthcare clinics at Pueblo Chemical Depot, Tooele Chemical Depot, and Dugway Proving Ground, Utah.
